# A message from Porto.

Porto has become a hotspot for foreign direct investment (FDI), and a growing international hub for knowledge and digital service companies.

International investment in Porto has surged since 2017, with more than 8 billion euros invested in region by foreign companies, and the city has received a number of distinctions thanks to its investment attraction policy headed by InvestPorto. These include the latest Financial Time's fDi ranking of cities of the future 2022/23, which placed Porto as the third best medium-sized city in Europe for FDI.

Porto is a resilient investment destination. The Covid-19 pandemic disrupted economies across the globe, including our own. But international investors' confidence in Porto remained strong. The number of new investment projects bounced back quickly in the second half of 2020 and surpassed its pre-pandemic peak by the end of 2021.

Digital and IT services have been one of the main target areas of investors in Porto. Back in 2018, Porto was named Europe's best start-up friendly city at the World Excellence Awards, and ranked as the continent's third fastest-growing tech hub according to Atomico. Building on that reputation, our city managed to build one of the leading Portuguese tech ecosystems. The region is already home to over 3,000 IT companies and the founding or headquarters location of about 1,800, leading Portugal in number of start-ups, patent filings and private R&D investment.

Porto's competitive edge stems from the region's vast pool of talent, its world-class universities, the city's thriving innovation and entrepreneurship environment, its optimal location with a modern digital infrastructure and great connectivity to EU and global markets, as well as Porto's unique quality of life and welcoming nature.

### Porto. A booming tech hub

A region bursting with digital and creative talent, powered by a strong entrepreneurial spirit, world-class universities and infrastructure, as well as regional actors that support the development of next generation digital technologies and businesses. These are some of the main factors why Porto has experienced a remarkable development of its tech ecosystem.

An increasing number of international companies are choosing the city of Porto and the surrounding region as a location to set up digital and IT service centres. Some leading examples are Natixis, Euronext, Continental, TeamViewer and BMW's joint venture with Critical Software, Critical TechWorks.

Porto offers access to a critical mass of experienced ICT professionals, researchers and service providers, capable of delivering complex and innovative projects. The city has been gaining prominence because of its strong talent pool and innovation potential, with a thriving tech start-up ecosystem closely linked to multiple engineering schools located in the region and leading ICT research facilities, such as INESC-TEC, the Institute of Telecommunications, and Fraunhofer Portugal.

Porto lives with its doors open to the world and its eyes set on the future. IT companies and R&D units based in Porto are highly competitive at the international level, with a success track-record in multiple fields. The region is equipped with a good transportation network, state-of-the-art telecom infrastructure and more than 60 science and technology centres.


Being a reliable environment, with a businessesoriented culture, Porto is becoming a place where people, especially young entrepreneurs, feel inspired to take risks in a multicultural and international setting. So much so that Porto and Northern Portugal stand out as the leading entrepreneurial hubs in the country, with a number of start-ups per capita that is 20% higher than the European average. This can be explained by Porto's combination of a region with a growing talent pool, not just in STEM areas but specifically in ICT fields, together with the presence of dynamic players, such as the local tech business association, Porto Tech Hub, the 50+ local tech communities, and the city policy commitments to make Porto a global city that attracts investors, businesses and innovators.

Striking examples of what Porto is capable of mobilising include the investments in digital projects and infrastructure by Porto Digital and initiatives of ScaleUp Porto, such as Doing Business or Future Shapers, that aim to promote innovation and entrepreneurship among the local entrepreneurs, investors, energizers, and communities.

Digital and IT services are booming in the Porto metropolitan area. There are already more than 3,285 tech companies in the region, of which around 1,830 are headquartered in Porto.

The region hosts one of the fastest-growing tech ecosystems in Europe. ## Quality source of talent

Porto provides access to a highly qualified, creative and multilingual workforce, backed by a great education system and a strong capacity to attract people.

The city captures the best talent from a region of proven educational excellence that has 11 Universities and 15 other Higher Education Institutions, with 24,350 students currently enrolled in technology programmes. The region's higher education system attracts not only Portuguese talent, but also an increasing number of foreign students thanks to its quality, affordability and growing popularity.

IT jobs, currently numbering around 21,875 in the Porto metropolitan area, have grown consistently at double-digit rates and could potentially double in

the next 5 years. Salaries remain very competitive by Western European standards. Nonetheless, IT professionals enjoy a high purchasing power, earning incomes significantly above the local average.

Porto has also risen the ranks to become one of the world's best destination for expats and digital nomads, scoring highly in terms of quality of life, happiness and ease of settling in. Together with benefits like the favourable NHR tax regime and the Tech Visa facilitation programme, this growing appeal has enabled companies to attract professionals from around the world.



# Porto attracts talent from a wide region with 26 higher education institutions offering engineering and technology programmes

The region has 24,350 students enrolled in IT, electronics, mathematics and statistics or biotechnology degrees. In the last 5 years, 18,840 students graduated in these fields.





### Rising tech ecosystem

#### A vibrant tech scene has flourished from Porto's qualified talent pool and supportive business environment.

Porto is home to one of the largest clusters of tech start-ups and scale-ups in Portugal and, in the last 5 years alone, over 40 foreign companies have established IT service centres in the city.

During the same period, the number of jobs and annual revenue generated by the local tech ecosystem increased at one of the fastest rates seen in Europe.

Porto has a reliable support system for entrepreneurship and innovation.


In addition to its competitive work force, education system and research institutions, the city provides the right business know-how, EU market access and good support infrastructure, hosting more than 40 business accelerators, incubators and co-working spaces.

These factors, together with the increasing demand for IT services, have contributed to the development of a tech ecosystem that is emerging on the European and global stages.

# One of Europe's fastest growing tech hubs

Porto's tech ecosystem recorded the second fastest job growth among all European cities in the World's top 100 most innovative cities.

Between 2015 and 2020, the combined revenue of Porto's tech ecosystem grew at an average rate of 12% per year, while the number of jobs grew even faster at 14% per year.

Of the European cities in the World's top 100 most innovative cities – according to the Innovation Cities<sup>TM</sup> Index 2021 -, Porto's tech employment grew at a pace second only to Dublin's.



### Strong innovation environment

A thriving tech scene, the clustering of multiple R&D facilities and a strong tradition of entrepreneurship and knowledge sharing between business, academia and scientific institutions make Porto a perfect testbed for innovation.

Porto and Northern Portugal have impressive figures to show on investments made in research and development (R&D), which these days is led by IT service companies. According to the European Commission's Regional Innovation Scoreboard 2021, it was the leading Portuguese region in number of patent applications, private R&D expenditure and improvements in innovation.

The regional scientific and technological infrastructure comprises 64 R&D facilities and over 12,500 research staff. Leading examples specialized in ITC engineering and computer science include INESC TEC, the Institute of Telecommunications and the Fraunhofer Portugal Research Centre for Assistive Information and Communication Solutions (AICOS), the first Fraunhofer R&D centre in Europe outside Germany.

Porto's heritage of industrialists who, over the years, created the manufacturing industries still based around the city, has a created a business-oriented culture, with a characteristic can-do attitude, that fosters entrepreneurship and innovation.

This tradition combined with the dynamic action of regional players, such as UPTEC, Porto Innovation Hub, ScaleUp Porto and Porto Tech Hub, has contributed to the development of an innovative city with more than 58 tech communities full of enthusiastic individuals who love to solve problems together with likeminded people.

# Smart location with future-proof infrastructure

Porto's location along the European Union's West Atlantic corridor, together with its high quality infrastructure and close market ties to a wide range of countries, make it strategically optimal for digital and IT service companies.

Over the years, Portugal has invested heavily in its communication infrastructure, which today ranks as 11th best in the world according to IMD's World Competitiveness Ranking 2021. Porto offers citywide fiber-to-the-home coverage, a reliable 4/5G mobile network, as well as an extended free public Wi-Fi network provided by Porto Digital.

It also benefits from sharing the same time-zone as London or Dublin, which is just one hour behind Central European Time and a 2 to 3-hour difference from markets as far as Brazil or South Africa.

Along its location and good communication infrastructure, Porto benefits from close proximity to all modes of transport. Thanks to its compact urban structure, the main regional and international

transport hubs are all located just 10 to 30 minutes away from Porto's downtown and Boavista central business districts (CBD). The public transport system of the Porto metropolitan area is reliable, eco-friendly and affordable, featuring an extended metro, train and bus network that ranks as the best in the country in terms of customer satisfaction.

Porto International Airport provides frequent non-stop flights to around 100 destinations per week, providing good air connectivity to Europe, North America and Brazil, including daily connections to global hubs such as Madrid, Paris, Frankfurt, London, Amsterdam, Istanbul and New York. Flights take on average 3 hours or less to reach cities in Western Europe and 7 to 8 hours to cross the Atlantic.









# Digital and IT service companies in the Porto metropolitan area


The following indicators represent the IT and digital services ecosystem of active companies headquartered in the city of Porto and the 16 neighboring municipalities that form the Porto metropolitan area.

#### Ecosystem overview

The ecosystem around Porto is increasingly international and highly dynamic. The region is the headquarters location of 1,830 active companies and home to 290 start-ups and scale-ups. Foreignowned ventures represent 12% of the total number of companies.







- Porto's ecosystem is rapidly booming. In the last 5 years, the combined revenue of digital and IT service companies in the region has grown at an average rate of 10% per year, exceeding 3B€ in 2020. The revenue of foreign-owned companies grew even faster, at an average rate of 15% per year.
- Exports to the EU common market account for 22% of revenues, while other export markets represent about 9%. Valued-added is more than a third of revenues.



#### Employment

- Digital and IT services companies in the Porto metropolitan area employed 21,875 workers. Companies tend to be small in size, employing an average of 12 employees.
- The vast majority of persons employed by IT companies were men. However, women represent 30% of IT employees in Porto, compared to the EU average<sup>2</sup> of 19%, making the local IT employee base more gender balanced than the European average.
- Salaries are highly competitive compared to Western Europe for both entry-level and more experienced hires.

#### Financing

- The financing structure of the companies from Porto's ecosystem is very well-balanced. Most are not heavily indebted and have easy access to finance.
- There are 35 companies with share capital above 1M€, representing just 2% of the companies in the ecosystem.


